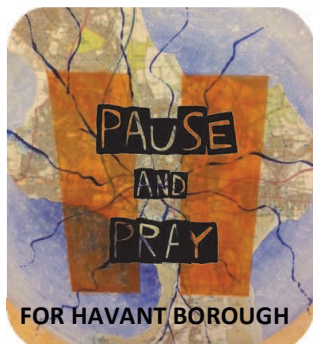

'In Flanders Fields the poppies blow'

Part 6 of a monthly series on the men of Bedhampton who lost their lives in World War 2 and whose names appear on the War Memorial in St. Thomas' or in the graveyard.

Arthur Ernest Burden (1909-1939)

Petty Officer Stoker, Number P/J 111687 HMS Royal Oak

Arthur was born on 6th January 1909 in Portsmouth to Walter and Rose Burden. His father, Walter, was serving in the Royal Navy as a Petty Officer Stoker. At the 1911 Census, Arthur and his parents were living at 6, Fratton Grove, Portsmouth with Florence, a sister to Arthur aged 4 months.

On 5th June 1929 Arthur followed in his father's footsteps by joining the Royal Navy as an Able Seaman, Service Number P/J 111687. In 1936 Arthur married Emily Maud Oldreive in Portsmouth. They had Florence in 1936, Ernest in 1938 and Doris in 1939.

On 7th June 1939 Arthur was posted to *HMS Royal Oak*, a Revenge class battleship launched in 1914. By the outbreak of war in 1939 the Royal Oak was no longer fit for front line duty and was at anchor in harbour at Scapa Flow. There had been some concern about the security of the fleet from attack in the months before the outbreak of war. A block ship had been sunk to make it more difficult but it was still possible if hazardous for a submarine to come into the harbour on the surface on a high tide.

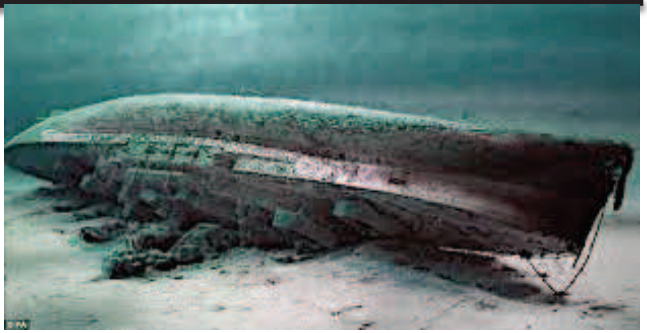


HMS Royal Oak

On the night of 14th October 1939, the German submarine U-47 commanded by Kapitanleutnant Gunther Prien was able to sail into the harbour on the surface because of the high tide that night. They remained undetected and seeing the *Royal Oak* and a number of other ships, the U-47 fired a salvo of torpedoes. The first torpedo struck at 12.58 pm. It caused confusion amongst the crew as most thought the dull thud was an internal problem. Still unaware that they were being attacked by a submarine, the crew of the Royal Oak failed to take any action. A third salvo hit the old battleship amidships causing a series of massive explosions. The ship began to roll over and water flooded into the open hatches causing her to sink in a matter of minutes. Many men were trapped in their bunks as the water came in. The U-47 was able to sail out of the harbour and return to a heroes' welcome in their home port.

The sunken battleship became a designated war grave to remember those like Arthur who had lost their lives that night.

Whilst Arthur was stationed in Scapa Flow, Emily and the children were living in Fareham

at 60, St. Michael's Grove. Later the family were living in Bedhampton. In 1950 Maud married again, to Joseph Colletta.

Arthur was not the only casualty of the sinking of the Royal Oak to be commemorated on the church war memorial. Able Seaman Albert Clarence Daughtrey also died on the *Royal Oak* that October night.

Youth Celebration on Bidbury Mead

The theme was food; its variety, where it comes from, how fortunate we are to have enough of it, how we waste it and how others are starving.



The afternoon started at 5.30pm with a picnic for the Rainbows, Beavers, Brownies and Cubs. At 6:00pm, the groups started round-robin activities; Supermarket Suite, Bingo Food, Human Fruit Machine, Cracker Eating, a Short Video in St. Thomas' and Pasta Fiesta.

At 6:30pm, the older groups of Scouts and Guides joined us and we had our service, led by Rev. Preb. Clive Williams. The Cross and flags were paraded in from St. Thomas' to an area we had prepared on The Mead. The Guides gave us three unusual varieties of Grace and the Scouts re-enacted the story of the loaves and fishes from the Bible. The loaves were handed out to the crowd – parents and children. We sang two songs: *Cauliflowers Fluffy* and *Food, Glorious Food*. Clive gave out a challenge which 10 Brownies took on to identify pictures of fruit and vegetables. Whilst these were being marked, he gave us a talk about food and the variety we have, how wasteful we are and how we should be grateful to God for it. Following this, the Brownies were called up in order of their really high scores to be applauded by the assembled crowd.



The Guides then led us in prayers on our theme of food. This was followed by all the groups bringing gifts up to the front for the Food Bank (two shopping trolleys worth). Clive gave a final blessing and the Cross and flags were paraded out.

The evening finished with a camp fire in the churchyard (in an altar fire – appropriately enough) and cooking for the older groups.

John the Baptist

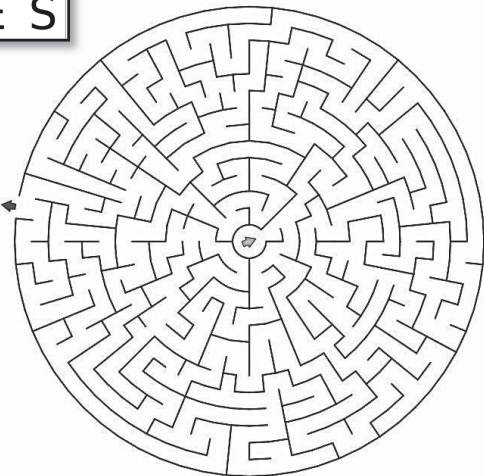
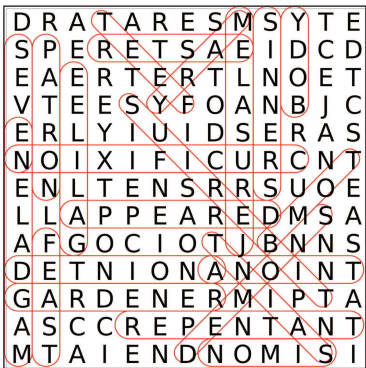
