Single Fathers

A while back I caught up with a friend of a friend who I occasionally bump into at various social events. I will call him Phil. Eventually, the small talk and blokey banter ran out and we actually got talking about what really matters. For Phil that is his work in a vocational role, a role he loves despite the low pay and pressure. Phil landed a rare job a couple of years ago which fulfils him and allows him time with his daughter who we will call Louise.

Louise lives with his ex-partner and the way Phil speaks of her it is easy to see that he is besotted. Phil spoke of the fact that he had booked all his holiday around school holidays, and was looking forward to spending that time with Louise. He spoke of how his Louise had struggled with mainstream school because of a condition; and how she did not automatically receive a place at a specialist school to help. $\pm 10,000$ later and the powers that be authorised the aid a day before the appeal court case, he mentioned that there was a possibility that his ex-partner might have to move across the country. There was no negative or malice in his voice, Phil simply said he would have to change the job he loves and move to be near Louise if they did relocate.

Phil is an inspiration; despite the past pains of failed relationships, he is seeking to be the best father he can be in his situation. Despite what we hear sometimes, there are thousands of men out in the world seeking to do just the same as he is. As I pondered this circumstance, and what my reaction should be to a situation of which I had no experience, I was drawn to a verse from James. 'Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.' James 1:27.

It's an odd verse to be drawn to, and I won't break it apart here, I will just leave it with you. As for me, I'm off to send an email to Phil, to invite him and Louise to the south some time. I need their inspiration, as much as they need my support.






The Christmas Prayer Tree

Saint Valentine's Day 14th February



Saint Valentine's Day, many believe, was named after one or more Christian martyrs and was established by Pope Gelasius 1 in 496 AD. Valentine of Rome was martyred about 269, and this day usually 'belongs' to him.

The first recorded association of Valentine Day with romantic love (1382) is from Geoffrey Chaucer. He wrote, 'For this was Saint Valentine's Day, when every bird cometh there to choose his mate.' This poem was in honour of the first anniversary of the engagement of King Richard II of England to Anne of Bohemia. Valentine Day is referred to by Ophelia in Hamlet (1600-1601).

To-morrow is St Valentine's day All in the morning betime And I a maid at your window To be your Valentine.

The modern mention of Valentine's Day can be found in a collection of English nursery rhymes (1784):

The rose is red, the violet's blue The honey's sweet, and so are you. Thou are my love and I am thine I drew thee to my Valentine.

'In Flanders Fields the poppies blow'

Part 11 of a monthly series on the men of Bedhampton who lost their lives in World War 2 and whose names appear on the War Memorial in St. Thomas' or in the graveyard.

William Ernest Irwin (1921-1944)

Electrical Artificer 4th Class RN – Service No. P/MX53497

William or 'Billy' was born on 26th February 1921 in Portsmouth to William Vincent and Susan Lily Irwin (Folland). His father worked as a Ships Joiner in HM Dockyard Portsmouth. Billy's older sister, Gwendoline had been born in 1915. Between the wars the Irwins were living at 32, St. Piran's Avenue, Portsmouth.

Billy was educated at the Northern Secondary School, now called Mayfield School in North End. In 1938 he received the Dawes Cup for the best 2nd year Apprentice Craftsman in the Electrical Dept. of the Naval Dockyard.

In 1943, Billy married Mary Webster in Wallsend, Northumberland which is where she came from. A son, William, was born to them in early 1944.





By that date, Billy was an Electrical Artificer 4th class on HMS Janus. She was a J class destroyer commissioned in 1939. On 22nd January 1944 Janus was supporting the Anzio landings as the allies sought to gain a foothold in Italy with the objective of reaching Rome. On the 23rd January, HMS Janus

was struck either by a glider bomb or a conventional torpedo. There are various conflicting accounts but whatever the weapon was used, the Janus suffered terrible damage and in within 20 minutes had sunk. There were 90 survivors, the rest being missing presumed dead. On 13th April 1944 an advertisement appeared in the Portsmouth Evening News placed by Billy's wife Mary. She asked for any survivors of the sinking of HMS Janus who had information about her husband, who was missing presumed dead, to get in touch with her at 44, Maylands Road, Bedhampton. That was 7 days after another article in the Evening News which had a short piece on Billy, including a picture of him.

It was the second time that naval tragedy had struck the family. In 1891 Billy's grandfather, Edwin Ernest Irwin a gunner in the Royal Navy and was drowned in Bermuda on 28th December. Billy's father died in 1966, his mother in 1976, and his sister Gwendoline in 2006.

Wordsearch The Presentation of Christ in the Temple or Candlemas

Candlemas, on 2nd February, comes exactly 40 days after Christmas. In New Testament times 40 days old was an important age for a baby boy: it was when they made their first 'public appearance'. Mary, like all good Jewish mothers, went to the Temple with Jesus, her first male child, to 'present Him to the Lord'. Thus, we have the Festival of the Presentation of Christ in the Temple. (Luke 2: 22-40) So where does the Candlemas bit come in? Jesus is described in the New Testament as the Light of the World, and early Christians developed the tradition of lighting many candles in celebration of this.
