Rector's Comments

That may not be entirely a Biblical concept and perhaps it could be argued that our purpose is to worship God, but we shall get to that another time. Let's agree for a moment that happiness is actually the goal for many people, the question then becomes what makes us happy? If happiness is found in owning fast cars and a big house, then 99% of the world's population are in the unhappy zone. This is not a trivial conversation to have. We see the repercussions of people seeking happiness in all the wrong places ending up in disaster in our society. Is there anyone of us that does not have their own story, however small, about making a bad decision? A choice that has led us down a path that caused pain when we were simply looking for happiness? A great faith leader once claimed, "I've found the recipe for being happy whether full or hungry, hands full or hands empty." No, it wasn't Jesus, but that is some claim, isn't it? A claim we shall investigate as our topic this week, when yes, the answer no doubt will be Jesus. But there is a little more to it than that, so join us as we investigate being happy and content.
