Collect

Lord, you have taught us that all our doings without love are nothing worth: send your Holy Spirit and pour into our hearts that most excellent gift of love, the true bond of peace and of all virtues, without which whoever lives is counted dead before you. Grant this for your only Son Jesus Christ's sake, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Rector's Reflections

This week we return to the biography of Jesus we call Matthew's Gospel. As we do so we hear the first of the parables that Jesus told. Many of these stories which Jesus used to teach people were based around farming because that was the culture in which he taught. This got me thinking about our culture and what the context of the stories would have been had Jesus taught in our time and society. Would there be a parable about a star struck singer who went to find fame and fortune on a TV show, only to find that peace and contentment was found back home in the heart of their family? Perhaps there would be a story teaching us how when we invest our savings in the hope of a comfortable life, we find it can all be turned upside down by a disease that ravages the world. Who knows? But it is interesting that Jesus used simple stories and words to share God's love so all of us could hear it. Perhaps there is a lesson for those of us churchy types who can sometimes use 'Christianese' words to show how much we think we know. Wow, I feel called to let the blood of the Lamb wash over me as I excogitate that, interceding with our Lord and lifting us up, that He might build a hedge of protection and gift us a servant's heart. Or I might just go and pray.
