Common Cup

We are happy to announce that from Easter Sunday we will return to offering wine from the common cup as an *optional* part of Holy Communion. There is a long tradition within the Anglican communion that receiving one or other of the elements is the same as receiving full communion. If you choose not to receive the wine you will have still received full Holy Communion.

St Nicholas' Refurbishment

The refurbishment work at St Nicholas' will start on 19th April!

For everyone's safety it is vital that the contractor has control of the construction area but we plan to allow the church and all the groups who meet at St Nicholas to remain fully operational.

The contractor needs to have control over the site while the work is carried out so temporary toilets will be constructed in the courtyard and all access to the Gwatkin will be via the kitchen.

Anything stored in rooms off the corridor, which might be needed during the construction period, will need to be relocated before building work starts. This includes items from the Kidszone, crockery store and the locker store.

If you or your group are unable to find somewhere to store items you will need during the construction period it may be possible to provide temporary open shelving on the stage but this will not be lockable
