In the late 1880's, the body of a young girl was pulled from the River Seine near the Louvre in Paris. The body showed no signs of violence but the pathologist is thought to have



been so struck by her beauty that he made a wax plaster death mask of her face. The most striking feature was her smile, comparisons were made with the enigmatic smile of the Mona Lisa. Copies of the mask of this unknown girl or L'Inconnue – which translates as 'Unknown Woman' - soon became popular in the drawing rooms of Europe. Her face became a muse for famous artists, poets and

grapes. I know that I'm not very good at smiling but I'm going to try harder because I realise that a smile is such great therapy for the one who is smiling and the one receiving it. Why don't we all try this simple way of being a blessing to one another?



And finally, maybe you don't think you've ever seen the famous smile of L'Inconnue but if you've ever done a first aid course than you have because she still features as the face of Resuscitating Annie.

BEDHAMPTON VOLUNTEERS KEPT BUSY

Springtime has proved to be a busy time for the Volunteers, tidying and developing an area in Lower Road. This involved the removal of brambles, creating a pathway and steps with woodchips and planting donated shrubs and other plants, together with grass seed and turf. Cold winds did not deter the progress of digging holes, nor the repainting of fencing. Irises and wild garlic have also been transplanted and bird boxes installed.

The other project starting is the changing of the Chinese Restaurant into a Coop store where the shrubs are due to be removed to make room for the carpark. The plan is for the entrance to be widened and the 'island' containing the palm tree, flowering cherry and grasses to be removed. The Volunteers have looked after this garden area for many years and the plants and shrubs belong to the community, so are hoping to continue.

The Volunteers are hoping for old fashioned April showers, although this month has proved to be one of the driest for many years. Rain is needed for the successful transplanting of many shrubs. One local garden is in the process of being cleared, with plants being donated to the BVs.

Ongoing jobs include weeding, pruning, topiarising, mowing edges, spreading woodchip in five gardens separated by time in between creating them.

Just before going to print, rain has at last helped with the current donated shrubs and plants being planted, but some struggling with the dry conditions, though some of our grass grown from seed now needs mowing.

One piece of good news is that hanging baskets will once more be hung this year after a two year gap, and more volunteers are being recruited to water them when needed. One BV previously compiled the spreadsheet for the diary of the watering, but it is not known when he will next be in circulation here, as he's in Australia. Anyone with the expertise to produce one, please? (copy of the previous one is available) That's why it's important to

know of people's preferences, as it's time consuming changing the format.

Volunteers may only be called upon to do some watering once a month if the rota works successfully. The watering of the hanging baskets will likely commence on 23rd May.

Wordsearch for June 2022

This year Her Majesty The Queen became the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee marking 70 years of service to the people of the United Kingdom, the Realms and the Commonwealth.

Celebrations will include The Queen's Birthday Parade (Trooping the Colour) on 2nd June when more than 1,400 parading soldiers, 200 horses and 400 musicians will come together. Beginning at Buckingham Palace, the Parade will move down The Mall to Horse Guard's Parade, joined by Members of the Royal Family on horseback and in carriages. The Parade will close with the traditional RAF fly-past, watched by The Queen and Members of the Royal Family from the Buckingham Palace balcony.

Platinum Jubilee Beacons: The United Kingdom's long tradition of celebrating Royal Jubilees, Weddings and Coronations with the lighting of beacons will also continue. Over 1,500 beacons will be lit throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories.

The Meaning of Colours - part 1

In March, April and May this year the coloured frontal of the altar will have been changed many times – as will the colour of the priest's vestments.

Each colour – and there can be as many as six in a church's store – has a different meaning. They reflect the significance of that day or the season.

In March purple was used as a symbol of penitence, as we were in Lent and trying to prepare ourselves for Christ's final act of love for each of us.

Holy Week – the time of Christ's final journey – was denoted by the colour red. Red, the colour of blood, is used for feasts of martyrs as well as those for the Holy Spirit – when it more likely represents his flames of 'fire' which rested on those in the Upper Room. At St Thomas, we retained the purple colour until Good Friday.

On Maundy Thursday, we sometimes switch to white for any Communion service, as this celebrates the remembrance of the first Communion with His apostles which He commanded us to continue.

Good Friday, and we were back to red, although many churches strip away all colours.

Then on Easter Sunday, the day of the greatest Christian Celebration, we entered to an altar bedecked in gold or the 'whitest' with the most elaborate decoration the church possesses.

'Plain' White will be used for the Easter Season signifying purity and Christ's triumph over death until Ascension Day on 26th May. This, being a special and more significant day in the life, death and resurrection of Christ, goes to gold again: then immediately back to white for the next ten days.

On the day of Pentecost itself, Whit Sunday, 5th June, the colour will be? Yes, you got it, red for flames of fire.

Watch out for the changing colours indicating the special meanings that day has in the life of the church. If you could choose a different colour for a different or even one of the same meanings, what would you choose and why?

In June it will all change again, to green, this time for 20 weeks, so we will consider those next month. Like the green grass feeds the animals, this month spend some time just looking at a patch of grass or the leaves on trees from a distance. See the different shades and hues and when you next hear the gospel reading imagine sitting under those trees on that grass with Jesus Himself.

Pentecost - **not** a **Ghost but** a **Gift.** We used to call it Whitsun – 'White Sunday' because long ago children marched to church in white on that day. No processions nowadays, and we've even changed its name. It is now 'Pentecost', which is more accurate but needs explaining. More next month.

BEDHAMPTON MU BRANCH MEETING – APRIL 2022

The scheduled talk for 26 April was to be by our Rector, Max, on Camino de Santiago Part 1 but, regrettably this had to be cancelled at the last minute due to a family emergency which left our leader Ann with somewhat of a dilemma, as none of the other planned speakers were able to change their arrangements at the last minute. What then to do????

In true Guiding tradition of being prepared, Ann had the brilliant idea of contacting our soon-to-be Curate, Jill Kingston to ask if she would be able to give a talk to the MU on her past career and how this led to her joining the Ministry.

Thankfully, Jill was free and came along that afternoon, complete with slides and illustrations, to talk about her career in the police force. At first, it seemed that working with the police and being part of the clergy seemed incongruous, to say the least but, as her talk progressed, it was clear to see how being in the police helped to assist in Jill's calling.

Jill began her career in the police as a very young recruit but quickly progressed up the ranks and was promoted to Inspector of the Marine Unit, co-ordinating events on water and preventing crime in general and was a post she found particularly rewarding. Later, Jill took on the role of Inspector for Major and Royal Events which encompassed arrangements for members of the Royal family and visiting dignitaries and, as you may imagine, raised many issues – some quite amusing – when things didn't quite go according to plan.

Jill and her late husband were happily married for some years and had two beautiful girls who are her pride and joy. On her first day of returning to work with the police after a very serious illness and lengthy absence, whilst sitting at her desk, she felt God's calling so strongly that she immediately resigned to follow her new path into the ministry. Jill and her family have suffered several heart-breaking events but throughout all the traumatic and unhappy times, her faith has remained strong and, in fact, has grown stronger. Although, after her husband's tragic passing, she had concerns as to how she would manage her calling with the sole responsibility of her two girls, she never once wavered in her decision to walk with God. Latterly she has been working in a mental health hospital and particularly found that her knowledge of mental health issues, when working with the police, assisted her greatly in her understanding and ability to offer comfort in her work with the patients, so assisting in their recovery and bringing them closer to God.

After her talk, Jill stayed on to have tea which gave us all the opportunity to chat with her. Needless to say, both members of the MU and some friends from Trefoil who had joined us for the occasion, thoroughly enjoyed the afternoon and are so looking forward to July when Jill joins us as our new Curate.
