Street Angels

Do you love your community here in Bedhampton?

So do we and that is why we have created Bedhampton Street Angels.

A Street Angel does one thing and does it well.

They look out for their street.

Could you adopt a street, or part of one?

The only qualification is the ability to look out for others.



What Is A Street Angel?

- A Street Angel looks out for others in their adopted street.
- If a Street Angel spots someone who might need a hand they inform the administration office who will do their best to signpost those in need to the best local organisation.
- If someone moves into their adopted street a Street Angel will inform the administration office so that a welcome pack can be delivered.
- A Street Angel may deliver updated news from the connected local community organisations, but no more than twice a year and only if they are physically able to do this.

What A Street Angel Is Not

- They are not representatives of any of the local organisations simply by being a Street Angel and do not present themselves as such.
- They are not cleared for any activity outside of their normal neighbourly interaction that they would undertake even if they were not a Street Angel.

HELP NEEDED BY BEDHAMPTON VOLUNTEERS

It is good to see the colourful displays of summer flowers in the hanging baskets around Bedhampton again, but of course, with this current spell of warm weather comes the need for regular watering so as not to allow them to dry out. Pete Spencer is asking for a few more volunteers to join the rota so that each person's commitment does not come around too frequently. The hot weather is sadly taking its toll on some of the baskets.

Meanwhile, Pete Spencer writes:

One evening recently saw 7 scouts, 3 leaders, Clive2 and myself back at the woodchip path at the end of Lower Road. Thanks to C2, the woodchip path is now continuous past the steps, without a gap, and waiting to be asked 'How long is it?'

The answer is 'not fur long', a furlong is 220 yards, and it's a yard over that. But many thanks to the scout work party which concentrated on turning the occasional pond every time it rains, to a reinstated system of 'almost' connected up ditches. This meant covering over the pipe and rubble with earth in order that the future path will be bridged, extending the path up to that point whilst avoiding the pyramidal orchid, and excavating the old established ditch that runs alongside the field. C2 had already cleared a section from the railway end. So only about 5 metres of new ditch to dig out, and any future water will avoid causing a flood plain. So we'll need some more woodchip, supplies are low!

On one morning, six heated individuals finished tidying the Imp Palace car park, four ballast bags full, and a trim around Cynthia Hoy's seat at the traffic lights.

For the hanging baskets maintenance, we had hoped to have gathered sufficient numbers to save changing a rota when new people come forward. However, in practice, there are certain days of the week to avoid, with varying other commitments. The arrangements for watering are designed to be as fair as possible to all volunteers.

The baskets this year are looking stunning but of course if they are to keep their good appearance in this warm weather, regular watering is essential.

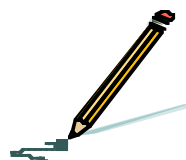
