Dear Friends,

"New Beginnings."

September is a month for a new autumn season and with it comes all sorts of new beginnings especially in the school calendar. I expect like me parents up and down the country will be busy sorting out school uniform, pencil cases and lunchboxes. Even in church we are moving on in the liturgical year, looking to Harvest and our preaching series 'fruitfulness on the frontline' - more on this coming shortly.

New things can be exciting. I have found much joy beginning my new role at Bedhampton, meeting new people, learning new things, and moving to my new house, but being out of my comfort zone has also been quite challenging.

Any new thing is stressful, change can be scary, starting a new school or joining a new class, worrying about making friends or finding your way around can cause us anxiety. I wonder if you have recently moved into the area or have thought about visiting St Thomas or St Nicholas. It can be nerve wracking turning up at a church for the first time but I can assure you of a warm welcome, I was also new a few months ago!

Stepping into a new way of being is difficult because of course with new beginnings something else must come to an end. Even through new and difficult things we know that God is always with us, he is alongside us in all we do and gives us strength to move forwards.

When St Paul first established his church in Philippi, he wrote joyful letters to the new disciples encouraging them in the new beginnings of their church. Paul knew that the Philippians would be finding it difficult with the challenges they had to face but he was full of confidence and trust in God. He prayed for the people there knowing that the life giving gospel of Jesus would give them strength.

Paul wrote: Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus (Philippians 4:6-7). Such wise words to keep us going in all that we do.

Ride+Stride Day is an exceptional opportunity to discover the rich heritage of our historic church buildings, see beautiful countryside, get some exercise travelling between the churches and have fun with friends and family. Ride and Stride is a chance for you, your family and friends to visit churches, chat with church representatives and learn more about the history and heritage of the churches. You can be sure the sponsorship money you raise will be used for repairs and restoration to the churches and chapels of Hampshire and the Isle of Wight.

As a participant your sponsored journey on Saturday 10th September 2022 between as many churches as you wish can be on foot, bicycle, scooter, horseback, canoe, bus or classic car, exploring and enjoying the countryside in Hampshire.

As there are over 400 due to be open you can have fun choosing which will be part of your itinerary. Many will have refreshments, some will have toilets open, and all should offer your group a warm welcome.

In 2021 Ride+Stride in Hampshire and the Isle of Wight raised over £60,000 of sponsorship money, including Gift Aid. This money helps to fund repairs to the historic fabric and features of churches as well as urgent repairs such as retaining walls in graveyards, leaky roofs and the installation of facilities to make Hampshire's historic churches, chapels and meeting houses of all denominations fit to serve local communities for future generations.

Now that Sam and Chloe Mutton have moved to a bigger house, they have just acquired a bigger proper sofa, a corner one. This is the first step to making Uganda fully their home! They realise that they need certain things to make life sustainable (a room just for the family to relax.)

Community barbecues are just wonderful with around 35 people every week. A different crowd each time! One Friday Sam was out, Vicky who lives with them wasn't around either and none of the staff were coming. Chloe says, "It was awesome as our little Arabella was a bit fraught so I couldn't do much. Everyone chipped in so that it really felt like a community barbecue. Everyone took ownership of cooking, serving, music, cleaning, opening the gate, etc. It really has helped that everyone owns these evenings.

"We now have a new kitten! (A highlight for Zara-Grace and Arabella, *above right*, rather than Sam,}

"We hosted Sean and Helen in our new home (our first visitors!)

"Arabella is now sitting on her own." Chloe managed to submit her recommendation letter info to the NGO bureau (15 documents). It is the next step of applying for a work permit where they will be able to not worry about visas for the next three years.

Family life has been busy and tiring, sadly with coughs and colds too, making for evenings when they just collapse!

#### CYCLIING

They now have containers on the land; one for cycle training, and one for a café. Eight new turbo trainers and eight fans are arriving sponsored by a US company, more than £10.000 worth of equipment for which they are very grateful.



#### COMMUNITY

Sam has visited the community as a supervisor. As a team, they have been praying for the Holy Spirit to guide and use them in their visiting.

They have been able to run the second cohort of sandals training and have even given out resources for six women to start their businesses.

DISPAS (Diplomatic Spouse Group in Kampala) were very generous and gave MJF some money for the community which was used to buy a sewing machine for the sandals and for training. A team from the UK came and helped to run holiday clubs in the community. Friends cooked lunch, others volunteered and 200 children came. We continue to request prayer for the family and for all our projects.


The day finished with a special awards presentation with Questions and Answers with three former cricket pros.
