

The message of Advent? – history is going somewhere!

What a contrast between the humble birth of Jesus in Bethlehem – and His eventual return! No one knows when that day will be, but it will be earth-shaking.

The Birth of Jesus at Bethlehem was to inaugurate our salvation. The Death of Jesus at Calvary established it – forever. The Resurrection of Jesus at Easter confirmed it. The Ascension of Jesus

to heaven celebrated it. The Gift of the Spirit at Pentecost drove it worldwide. The message of Advent reminds us that history is not circular or locked into an unending stalemate.

The Bible has had many pre-runs of that final 'Day of the Lord.' Noah's flood, the overthrow of wicked Babylon; these and other upheavals were but pointers to the final 'Day of our Lord Jesus Christ' (1 Corinthians 1:8), when all wrongs will be stopped, and the Lord shall reign with justice. The Bible is clear that world history is leading to *a Conclusion*, to the new heaven and the new earth. Christ's return will make it final! *See* 1 Thessalonians 4:17 - 'And so we will be with the Lord for ever.'

Andrew - the first disciple of Jesus

Andrew, whose feast day ends the Christian year on 30th November, is probably best known to us as the patron saint of Scotland, though his only connection with the country is that some of his bones were reputedly transported in the 8th century to Fife and preserved at a church in a place now named St Andrews.

The Gospels record that he was one of the first disciples of Jesus, and the very first to bring someone else to Christ - his own brother. Like many fervent Jews at the time, Andrew and an unnamed companion had been drawn to the desert, to be taught by the charismatic prophet known to us as John the Baptist.

One day when John pointed out Jesus to Andrew and his friend and described him as the 'Lamb of God', the two young men assumed that the next stage of their spiritual search was about to unfold. So, as Jesus made off, they followed him.

Jesus turned and asked them what they were 'seeking'; they lamely responded by asking where he was staying. He replied, 'Come and see'.

The results of their response were in this case life-changing - for themselves, and for many other people. Andrew brought his brother, Peter, to Jesus. The next day Jesus met Philip and called him to 'follow'. Philip then brought Nathaniel. The little apostolic band who would carry the message of Jesus to the whole world was being formed. They came, they saw, they were conquered! And right at the front of the column, as it were, was Andrew, the first disciple of Jesus.

200 years ago, on 20th October 1822, the Sunday Times newspaper was first published in the UK.

Two local women completed the Iron-man Vitoria-Gasteiz to raise money for the charity Stop Domestic Abuse.

Leeanne Barber and Lisa Phipps, both fitness instructors, decided that they wanted to complete a full IRONMAN challenge but they had to postpone this due to Covid. They continued to undertake intensive training to prepare for the gruelling challenge which consisted of a 2.4 mile open water swim, a 112-mile bike ride followed by a marathon. In July of this year, the pair flew to Spain and



completed the event in under 12 hours, raising £5,000 for the Havant-based charity. Leeanne said: 'This was such a tough challenge both physically and mentally. I'm delighted that we have successfully raised vital funds to help Stop Domestic Abuse build a new local,



child-centred, holistic refuge.'
The two women have raised a significant amount of money that the charity is hoping to put towards the building of a new dedicated refuge for women and children fleeing domestic abuse.

St Thomas Churchyard

An extract from the Hampshire and Isle of Wight edition of The King's England and edited by Arthur Mee. It was first published in 1939.

It gives Portsmouth fresh water from the springs. Bordering a busy highway, it has a quiet corner where the church stands away from the village, with beautiful old houses and noble trees. There are two old vews in the churchvard. one leaning on a staff when we called, though his sturdy mate needs no support, being over 20 feet round and still growing. The church has a beautiful chancel arch resting on graceful pillars and decorated with diamonds and chevrons by some of the earliest Norman craftsmen. On the walls is a mass dial from the days before clocks, and in the chancel is a mediaeval piscina. There is a massive 13th century bench carved with flowers, and among the other old work are traces of the mediaeval screen, and timbers in the roof of the nave.




