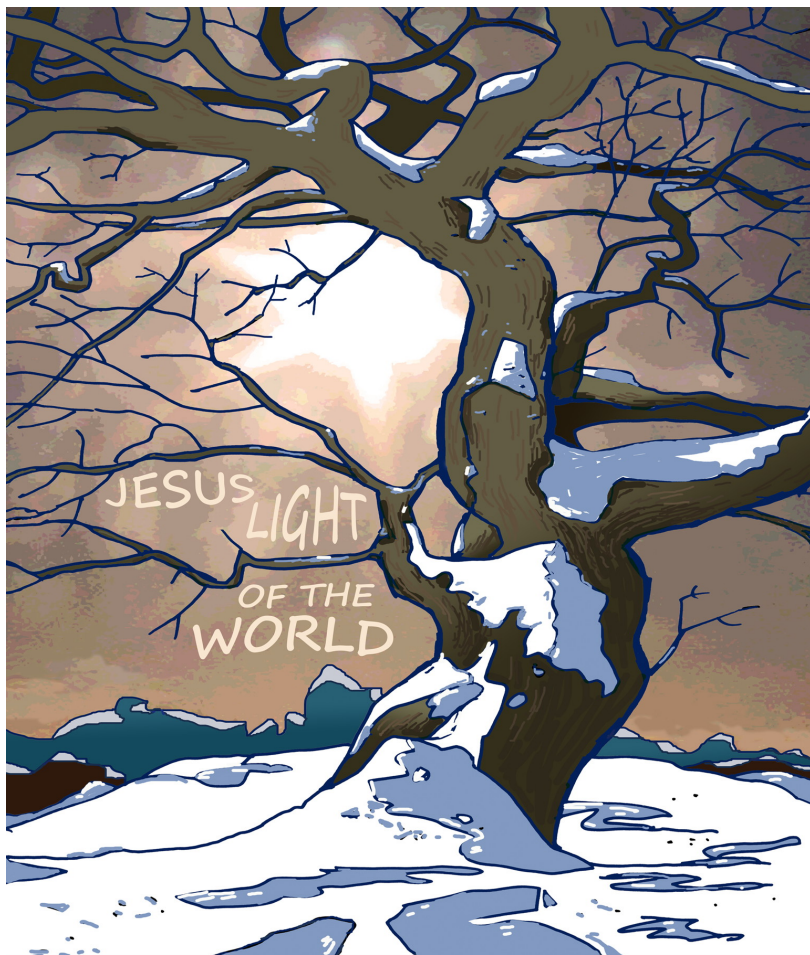

6th January: Epiphany

On 6th January we celebrate Epiphany - the visit of the Wise Men to the baby Jesus. But who were these Wise Men? No one knows for sure. Matthew calls them 'Magi', and that was the name of an ancient caste of a priestly kind from Persia. It wasn't until the third century that they were called kings - by a church father, Tertullian.

Another church father, Origen, assumed there were three - to correspond with the gifts given. Later Christian interpretation came to understand gold as a symbol of wisdom and wealth, incense as a symbol of worship and sacrifice, and myrrh as a symbol of healing - and even embalming. Certainly Jesus challenged and set aright the way in which the world handled all three of these things. Since the 8th century, the Magi have had the names Balthasar, Caspar and Melchior.

Epiphany is also known as 'Twelfth Night', or the last night of the Christmas festival.

The work is 100 percent funded by people like you who put their trust in MSF. Across 72 countries, including conflict zones, epidemics and natural disasters, they work hard to make sure that your donation is spent in an efficient way that ultimately saves lives. MSF UK does not take money from governments, but relies on the support of

individuals, as well as the institutions, foundations and companies they make up. This independent funding means they have the freedom to act fast. They can stay neutral in complex environments and conflict zones, as well as providing impartial care to people regardless of ethnicity, religion or politics. MSF's emergency teams can only launch a rapid response thanks to 'unrestricted' donations.

They set up and run medical services, build facilities, transport supplies and train staff themselves. In many places, they also support existing healthcare staff with professional development and resources – an investment that means life-saving healthcare will continue, even after they leave.

At present, thousands of people in Yemen are facing famine. MSF aims to provide help with medical needs; providing coffee tree seeds, fertilizer, pipes, water tanks and other farming equipment; providing nutrition to those experiencing lack of access to food, and by helping to provide clean sustainable water to thousands of people. Hunger has reached extreme levels, with 2.3 million children needing treatment for malnutrition.

MSF is busy at work in other countries too including Afghanistan, Ukraine and Chad; in Greece with refugees who have crossed the Mediterranean Sea; and in areas affected by HIV and AIDS. They provide medical assistance to people affected by conflict, epidemics, disasters, or exclusion from healthcare. Teams are made up of tens of thousands of health professionals, logistic and administrative staff - most of them hired locally.

MSF is saving the lives of people trying to cross the central Mediterranean Sea with their own search and rescue vessel, *Geo Barents*. They also provide assistance to people held in Libyan detention centres and those arriving in Europe.

Ingredients:

- 1 ½ lb of Judges 5:25 (end)
- 2 ½ lb of Jeremiah 6:20
- 3 1 tablespoon of 1 Samuel 14:25
- 4 3 of Jeremiah 17:11
- 5 ½ lb of 1 Samuel 30:12
- 6 ½ lb of Nahum 3:12 (chopped)
- 7 2 oz of Numbers 17:8 (blanched and chopped)
- 8 1 lb of 1 Kings 4:22
- 9 2 Chronicles 9:9
- 10 a pinch of Leviticus 2:13;
- 11 1 teaspoonful of Amos 4:5
- 12 3 tablespoons of Judges 4:19

Preparation:

- Mix 8, 9, 10 and 11, and put them aside.
Beat 1, 2 and 3 to a cream.
Still beating add 4, one at a time.
Then add 5, 6 and 7 and beat again.
Then add 12.
Bake in a low oven for 1½ hours.

DATES AND ANNIVERSARIES

All in the month of JANUARY

250 years ago, on 17th January 1773 Captain James Cook's ship, the *HMS Resolution*, became the first ship to cross the Antarctic Circle, during his second voyage.

200 years ago, on 26th January 1823 Edward Jenner, the British physician and immunologist who created the first vaccine, died. The vaccine was for smallpox.

125 years ago, on 14th January 1898 Lewis Carroll died. Best known for *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland*, *Through the Looking Glass* and the poems *Jabberwocky* and *The Hunting of the Snark*.

100 years ago, on 8th January 1923 the first BBC outside broadcast took place, at the British National Opera Company's production of *The Magic Flute* from Covent Garden London.

90 years ago, on 18th January 1933 David Bellamy, the botanist, TV presenter and environmentalist was born. (Died 2019)

80 years ago, on 30th January 1943 on the 10th anniversary of Adolf Hitler becoming Chancellor of Germany, the British RAF launched a massed air raid on Berlin.

70 years ago, on 31st January and 1st February 1953 the North Sea flood took place. North-western Europe was hit by extensive flooding when severe gales, combined with a spring tide. Over 1,800 people were killed in the Netherlands, over 300 in Eastern England, and 28 in Belgium. A further 133 people were killed when the Princess Victoria car ferry capsized off Scotland, and many fishing boats sank.

60 years ago, on 23rd January 1963 the British Intelligence Officer and Soviet Spy, Kim Philby, defected to the Soviet Union.

50 years ago, on 30th January 1973 the Watergate scandal began when seven men were convicted of conspiracy, burglary and wiretapping in Washington DC.

40 years ago, on 17th January 1983 that Breakfast Television was launched in the UK with the BBC's Breakfast Time programme. The ITV's TV-am followed on 1st February.

30 years ago, on 5th January 1993 the Liberian-registered oil tanker *MV Braer* ran aground off the Shetland Islands, spilling 84,700 tons of crude oil into the sea, and causing massive ecological damage.

25 years ago, on 23rd January 1998 the film *Titanic* was released in the UK.

20 years ago, on 31st January 2003 that the British born terrorist Richard Reid (the 'shoe bomber') was sentenced to life imprisonment in the USA, after he attempted to blow up a transatlantic flight using explosives concealed in his shoes. He later declared his allegiance to al-Qaeda.

Finding Choral Evensong: the relaunch of the world's only online directory

The Choral Evensong Trust has just relaunched its website to help you find a choral evensong near you. Just visit: www.choralevensong.org

During its seven years of existence, choralevensong.org has had 30,000,000 hits from 600,000 visitors, accessing services on offer at over 350 churches and cathedrals on Sundays, and also every weekday in most cathedrals and many college chapels in Oxford, Cambridge and elsewhere.

The website has grown to incorporate live streamed services, a 'Choir of the Month' feature and has begun to share services of Choral Evensong as far away as Australia. It also includes a listing of the comparable service of Choral Vespers in Roman Catholic churches, cathedrals and monasteries.

John Rutter, composer for the Royal Wedding and conductor, says "Choral Evensong gladdens the heart, ravishes the ear, and restores the soul – my favourite way of spending an hour with glorious music in a glorious building.

Choral Evensong has been celebrated in Anglican churches since the sixteenth century. The charity's first website was launched on the Feast of St Cecilia (patron saint of musicians) in 2015.

Locally, services of Choral Evensong take place at our churches including St Faith's in Havant, St Peter's in Petersfield, as well as our Cathedral in Portsmouth.

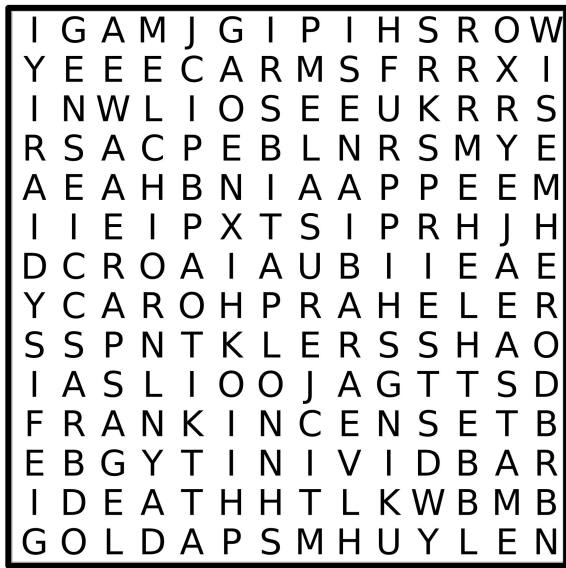

Wordsearch – January - *The Coming of the Magi*

‘Where is the One who has been born King of the Jews? We saw His star in the east and have come to worship Him.’ So Matthew tells of the coming of the Magi, or Wise Men, to the baby Jesus. Today we remember it on Epiphany, on 6th January. Did they come from Arabia Felix – nowadays southern Arabia? How many came? No one knows, but by the 6th century they were named Gaspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. Why gold, frankincense and myrrh? Gold stands for kingship: Jesus was King of the Jews. Frankincense stands for divinity; Jesus was to be worshipped. Myrrh stands for death and burial; Jesus would become a sacrifice and die for His people. The Wise Men were the very first gentiles ever to worship Jesus. Isaiah foresaw this response to Jesus: ‘Nations will come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn.’ The Magi wanted to worship Jesus; Herod wanted to kill Him. But the Jewish leaders who knew about the prophecy of a Messiah born in Bethlehem did not even bother to visit to Bethlehem. And it is only six miles from Jerusalem!
