A new year is often a time that we take stock of where we are and what we hope for the future, but what is this moment in time for our God who exists throughout all time? I shared with some of our leaders this week how Suzy and I prayed a thanks to God for being the same today as he was before the new year and will be throughout this whole year. God's desire for us is the same this year as it was last year. Not that we would read the Bible in a year, although that might be good. Not that we would commit to meeting every week to worship or that we would promise daily prayer, both of which would be great. God's desire for us is that we would simply turn the whole of who we are towards him. Perhaps a couple of sentences from The Methodist Covenant Prayer sum it up. "I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things to your pleasure and disposal. And now, glorious and blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, you are mine and I am yours." Now that is a new year's prayer worth saying.
