Curate's Comments

In this week celebrating Christian unity I was reminded of a Rowan Williams quote that we were given in training, that as disciples of Christ we had to be "lookout...interpreter...weaver."

Spotting need and working out how best to help people in Bedhampton is understandable, but weaver? What does that mean? My interpretation is that the warp, the vertical yarns that need to be in place before the weaving can begin, is us studying the bible, praying, our patterns of worship and missional aspirations. Mission is summarised by the Church of England as: spreading the Good News, encouraging new believers, acts of loving service, challenging injustice, preserving God's creation. The people that deliver the missional activity, and just as importantly, those who do the support functions (wardens/vergers, techies, treasurers, teamakers, clearer-uppers), form the weft. The most obvious bible reference to all this is Colossians 2:2 "I want you woven into a tapestry of love, in touch with everything there is to know of God." Paul is seeking unity within the community. Just as threads are woven together to create beautiful cloth, God wants the Colossians and US to be unified in love, support and understanding both as HIS church and to serve out in our glorious community.
