## Pentecost

When Jesus was preparing the disciples for the time when he would no longer be with them on earth, he said to them, "I will ask the Father and he will give you another Counsellor to be with you forever", (John 14, v.16). I wonder who the disciples were expecting? Given all the disciples had witnessed in the company of Jesus, the walking on water; the miraculous healings, they will have been anticipating someone or something very special.

The disciples witnessed Jesus ascending into heaven (forty days after His resurrection) and afterwards returned to the room at which they were staying in Jerusalem, and "They all joined together constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary....and his brothers" (Acts 1, v. 14). We can only guess at the content of their prayer, but it is probable they included requests for the arrival of the promised Counsellor.

It was only another ten days later that the Counsellor, the Holy Spirit arrived. Acts Chapter 2 describes the dramatic arrival of the Holy Spirit. The disciples were gathered together " in the same place" when they heard the sound of the blowing of a violent wind from heaven which filled the whole house in which they were sitting; and the sight of what appeared to be tongues of fire resting upon all of them"; and they also received the gift of speaking in tongues, other than their own. (Acts Chapter 2, verses 1 to 4)

At this time Jerusalem was crowded for one of the three major festivals of the Jewish year, the Feast of Weeks which is a festival of thanksgiving for harvested crops. These festivals were attended by many people of Jewish origin living outside of Israel, as well as by the residents. Verses 6 to 11 of Acts Chapter 2 lists the many parts of the world in which the visiting Jews lived. These visitors were amazed to hear the disciples speaking in languages they understood.

## **PARISH NEWS**

The disciple Peter, inspired by the Holy Spirit, addressed the crowd telling them about God pouring out the Holy Spirit upon all people, and also about the life, crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus. Peter encouraged the listeners to repent of their sins and to be baptised. His speech must have been powerful, for 3,000 people were baptised that day.

We celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, 50 days after the resurrection, this year on 8th June. Pentecost is considered by many people to mark the birth of the Christian Church. Many of the 3,000 baptised on the first Pentecost remained faithful when they returned home from the festival and they spread the Good News amongst family and friends, creating a network of worshippers, meeting, not at churches, but in small groups in homes.

In John verse Chapter 7, verses 37 to 39, Jesus declares that anyone who believes in Him receives the Holy Spirit, perhaps not in a manner as dramatic as the disciples experienced, but the Holy Spirit is within us to give help and guidance. How?

Consider the fruit of the spirit (Galatians Chapter 5, verses 22 and 23), love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness and self control. So, next time when you perform an act of kindness or respond to a call for a volunteer to help, allow the Holy Spirit take control.

The Holy Spirit knows our strengths and weaknesses and leads us accordingly.

## A statement following the death of Pope Francis

The Archbishop of York has issued a statement following the news of the death of Pope Francis. Here are excerpts from that statement:

"'Let us walk together, work together, pray together.' These are the words Pope Francis said to me when we met in 2023. They sum up his vision for the church, both the Roman Catholic Church but also ecumenically.

"Francis's whole life and ministry was centred on Jesus who comes among us, not to be served, but to serve. We saw that in Francis's service of the poor, his love of neighbour especially the displaced, migrant, the asylum seeker, his deep compassion for the wellbeing of the earth and his desire to build the church in new ways. Francis showed us how to follow Jesus, and encouraged us to go and do likewise.

"His encyclicals and teachings were supported by his deeds and actions. His whole life was instantly recognisable as those of one who followed Jesus.

"Pope Francis was acutely aware of the divisions between our churches, and I remember the powerful work he did with the then Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, and the Moderator of the Church of Scotland in promoting peacebuilding in South Sudan.

"I remember, in the brief times I spent with him, how this holy man of God was also witty, lively, good to be with, and the warmth of his personality and interest in others shone out from him. May he rest in peace and rise in glory.

On 8th May, following several sightings of black smoke from the Vatican, white smoke was seen meaning that the Cardinals had agreed on a successor to Pope Francis. It was then revealed that he is Robert Provost, a Peruvian from Chicago, to be known as Pope Leo XIV, the first American Pope ever to be elected.

### **CLERGY NEWS**

Rev. Jill Kingston, former curate from our parish, is moving on from her year at St Francis' Leigh Park to Corhampton in the Meon Valley. The Church was built around 1040 and has no dedication. We send Jill our love and good wishes for her new ministry in that parish.

Meanwhile, Rev. Jo Lorimer, our own Curate, is to be ordained Priest in Portsmouth Cathedral on Saturday 28th June at 4pm.

The services are traditionally held during Petertide (29th June), a feast day that remembers the martyrdom of Saint Peter. He was the fisherman who became a devoted disciple of Jesus, and who then went on to be an instrumental figure in the early Church in Jerusalem. Ordinations this summer will be held in a variety of cathedrals across the country.

## Deanery Pilgrimage Walk: Wednesday 4th June.

Day 3 of our Thy Kingdom Come pilgrimages brings us to Havant deanery. Pilgrims will begin their walk at St Peter's Church in Hayling Island and walk to churches in Havant, Bedhampton, Crookhorn, Waterlooville and Hart Plain, before ending at Catherington.

We'll be praying together as we walk around, taking time to pray at every stop on the way as listed in this schedule.

We realised it had been a while since we last updated you all on how we are. Life feels like we are spinning plates;, just as you think you are about to find a new normal another plate appears! It's been a lot but we are always growing and learning!



### Muttons

Life has felt full. We started the year

thinking and praying about a plan for the year, we started the year excited but also exhausted. Living here in Uganda is a joy but also has a certain level on intensity to it. We realised we have now lived here for 6 years as we moved here in May 2019. We have only been back to the UK for weddings and giving birth so far and had a few extended breaks in East Africa inbetween. We realised if our life will continue to be sustainable we need space as a family to breathe and reset. Zara-Grace has just started school so our best time to travel is in July. Therefore we are taking a month out as a mini sabbatical. We had hoped to go on a retreat week or go to a conference but costs made it a bit difficult, plus Sam's new church work commitments. So, we will be in Kenya for a month in July with the intention to retreat, to rest, to discern and pray about our future. We hope that we can rest as well as be intentional about our growth and development! Please do pray for us during July specifically as we reset and that we would really hear from God.

### **Family News**

- Zara-Grace started school, it is a sweet international pre-school and Sam walks Zeeg to school every morning. It's around 15 minutes walk away!
- Both our mums came to visit in March. Mum (Louise) was able to help with the Women's Day event which was really special, reconnecting with so many in the community. We enjoyed being able to live life with her and the kids loved having Grandma time! Jo (Mother in Law) also came out after to celebrate Arabella turning 3 which was special! She was able to have lots of time with the kids and blessed us with lots of goodies too!
- Sam started playing padel and got hooked! He has enjoyed being part of tournaments and finding some new friends!
- Chloe found some new friends and started a mums workout group every week. It has slowed down now people have started travelling but it has been a nice routine!
- We celebrated Zeke turning 1, Arabella turning 3 and Sam turning 33!
- Zara-Grace started sleeping through the night in her bed which feels like a miracle!!

### Community

If you have been following our Musizi Newsletter you would have seen a lot of sadness. We have struggled with severe flooding, deaths of children in our communities, multiple still births, friends with liver failure and our baby Kalim we told you about last year also died. It's been a pretty tough season in the community. Our whole team have felt overwhelmed at times. Life is full of ups and downs and being committed to being alongside others brings those ups and downs into your life too. As a team we thank God for our commitment and relationship to Baby Kalim, by the time we reached (3 hours after he died) no-one had done anything. We went to the police, chairman of the area and arranged the burial. It was emotionally so awful but we are so thankful that Musizi Joy was there as I don't know what would have happened if not. Mama Kalim didn't have enough money to even pay for the burial. Moments like this remind us of the fragility of life but also that beautiful story of Esther.

### Church

It has been a funny season at Church. The Church have been looking for a Senior Pastor for the past 5 years and the leadership has changed a lot over the years due to the transient nature of living here for many of short term contracts. This means that when it comes to finalising on a pastor, it is very dependent on the leadership team and who is around. Just a few weeks ago they finalised on a new Senior Pastor at Church. It has been a long process of interviews and questions and ultimately has brought a lot of stress to Church life. Not everyone is in agreement, and it's been challenging with relationships at Church and knowing how to move forward.

Youth work specifically has been a joy though, being involved with bi-weekly youth events and planning various events for them. Sam has some interns now which has been a huge stress reliever when it comes to children's work as he now knows he has enough volunteers each week rather than me (Chloe) always stepping in!

## **Cycling**

After the opening of the Bike Park, its continued on a good trajectory. People use it weekly and it continues to be a blessing to so many. The cafe has been going steady, not yet made profit but that is okay. Big Give fund-raising was able to secure staff contracts for the year which was a huge blessing.

There are lots of new ideas and hopefully bike rentals will be secured this year which will make a huge impact for the Bike Park but the logistics aren't always as straight forward as you'd think. We have been sending 2 of our lads on mechanic training; they now have some opportunities to put their skills to use soon so that will be great to see! If you'd love to pray for us, here are our key things; Wisdom and rest in July; Energy; Our Continued Good Health and our Finances. We love hearing your life updates too!

### **BACK IN TIME in June**

- 500 years ago on 13th June 1525, German Protestant Reformer Martin Luther married Katharina von Bora, a nun whom he had helped to escape from a convent.
- 250 years ago, on 23rd June 1775, the first Thames Regatta was held in London.
- 250 years ago, on 14th June 1850, the Second Continental Congress established the Continental Army which later it became the United States Army. On 15<sup>th</sup> June, George Washington, who would become first President of the USA, became the Army's Commander-in-Chief. This army would defeat the British army, and America would declare independence the following year, on 4th July 1776.
- 175 years ago on 24th June 1850, Herbert Kitchener, the 1st Earl Kitchener, was born. This Irish-born British Army officer and politician became Secretary of War during WW1.
- 150 years ago, on 3rd June 1875, George Bizet, French Romantic composer, died of a heart attack at 36. Best known for his opera *Carmen*.
- 90 years ago, on 1st June 1935, driving tests became compulsory for all new drivers in Britain.
- 75 years ago, on 11th June 1955, the first successful ascent of Annapurna in the Himalayas was made. It was a French expedition and the first successful ascent of a mountain over 8,000 metres. Annapurna is the tenth highest mountain in the world.
- 70 years ago on 11th June 1955, the Le Mans disaster took place. A car spun off the track during the Le Mans 24 Hour race in France, and the driver, Pierre Levegh, and 83 spectators were killed, with 100 more injured. It was the greatest loss of life in the history of motorsport; however the race was not stopped but continued.
- 65 years ago on 28th June 1960, the Six Bells Colliery disaster took place in Monmouthshire Wales. 45 coal miners were killed by a gas explosion.
- 50 years ago on 7th June 1975, the first Cricket World Cup to be held in England began.
- 50 years ago on 18th June 1975, the first North Sea oil was pumped ashore to Britain.
- 40 years ago, on 2nd June 1975, UEFA banned all English football clubs from playing in European competitions following the Heysel Stadium disaster of 28th May. The ban was lifted after five years.
- 30 years ago, on 25th June 1995, Ernest Walton, Irish physicist died. He was the first person to split an atom.
- 25 years ago, on 10th June 2000, the Millenium Bridge opened in London. It closed for a while two days later, when it was found to sway uncomfortably when people walked in step.
- 15 years ago, on 28th June 2010, the US Supreme Court ruled that American citizens have the right to own a gun, regardless of which state they live in. The right is protected by the Second and the Fourteenth Amendments. There are an estimated 393 million privately owned guns in the USA, and about 340 million people.

Father's Day is a day to honour and appreciate our fathers and father figures, such as grandfathers and fathers-in-law. Many of us will make a special effort to see them on the day. No two fathers are alike, of course, but various polls across the internet reveal some interesting similarities of what people have most valued in their dad.

These traits include: being dependable, approachable, protective, patient, affectionate, honest, willing to listen, compassionate, and having spent time with them when they were young. That's quite a list! People whose fathers had even some of those strengths have a lot to be thankful for.

Thankfully, our Father in Heaven certainly has all those traits. Jesus said the Father is totally dependable and protective of us, longs for us to turn to Him, and is full of compassion and love. And we are to call Him 'Abba' - Daddy!

Whilst Mothering Sunday has been celebrated for hundreds of years and linked to the Church, Father's Day is a little more recent. Mother's Day is celebrated world wide in May but not in a religious context.

Father's Day probably originated in the US and there are several stories of how it started. The most popular, and likely account, is that it started with a woman called Sonora Louise Smart in Washington. After her mother died in childbirth with her sixth child, her dad brought up the family. In 1909, Sonora heard a speech in church about Mother's Day and thought dads should also be celebrated. Several local clergymen accepted the idea and it's believed that 19th June 1910 was the first unofficial Father's Day.

In 1966, US President Lyndon B. Johnson decided the third Sunday in June should be Father's Day. However this date is not kept world wide.


